Take a tip from Hercules



Hercules Propellers has made a number of "small but significant" improvements to its range of bespoke airscrews. The first innovation is a 'Spitfire Tip' - a slight reshaping reminiscent of the fighter's

wing planform. "Despite popular belief, the Spitfire's wing is not elliptical," says the company, "An ellipse is but a simple oval, but is shaped to produce an elliptical spanwise lift distribution curve the most efficient. So Hercules's adoption of this tip shape is not only aesthetically pleasing, but should also improve the thrust-todrag ratio."

Hercules' second enhancement is to their airscrews' embedded polyurethane leading-edge protection strips. Originally cold-cast, these are now hot-moulded in 'Hercuthane' (company proprietor Rupert Wasey wanted to call it 'Herculoid', but that name was already copyrighted, improving their stability over a temperature range from -/+50°C, and can be colour-matched to the

propeller's exterior paint finish, minimising the visual effect of stoneinduced paint chips. For more information and prices visit hercprops.com or tel: 01453 885853.

ASI's Visit ATC Days are back
